General Information

The Ballettschule Theater Basel is the largest professional school for dance in the tri-country area of Switzerland, Germany and France and is recognized worldwide as one of the leading professional schools in Europe. Our Junior School provides children and teenagers with high quality classes and our Senior School trains talented students who aspire to a career as a professional dancer. Graduates have joined renown companies throughout the world.

The school is closely linked to the city of Basel and the ballet company in Basel. The close association with Ballett Theater Basel and its director, Richard Wherlock, allows students to experience the daily artistic life of a professional theatre and enables selected students to participate in the company's performances and projects. Scholarships are awarded to exceptionally talented and committed students as required.

We work together with regionally, nationally and internationally successful teachers, guest teachers and pianists. In addition to being exposed to the creative process by working with present day choreographers such as Richard Wherlock and Heinz Spoerli, students have performed works of Kenneth McMillan and George Balanchine, two of the greatest choreographers of the 20th Century.

BTB is a Prix de Lausanne Partner School. The Prix only recognizes schools in the world that have an exceptionally high level of dance education. The school aspires to meet this standard every day.

All professional students have the opportunity to receive an academic education and graduate with a "Diploma of Professional Dance" (EFZ) that is recognized by the Swiss Federal Government.

All students and members of staff are fully committed to achieving the highest standards of excellence. At the same time, our philosophy places the physical and emotional wellbeing as well as the personal development of our students at its core.

Richard Wherlock – Director Ballett Basel

Director Ballett Theater Basel

Born in Bristol, Great Britain, Richard Wherlock studied at the renowned Ballet Rambert Academy and went on to dance with the Ballet Rambert Company and Tanz Forum Köln. In 1991 Richard Wherlock became the Ballet Director at Theater Hagen, and beginning in 1996 directed the Ballet Company at Theater Lucerne for three seasons. He was then invited to become the Artistic Director and Choreographer of the Berlin Ballett, Komische Oper Berlin. In 2001 Richard Wherlock took over the position of Director and Choreographer of the Ballett Basel, where he remains today. He was additionally the Artistic Director of the 'Basel tanzt' Festival from 2004-2009.

His guest engagements include works choreographed for the following companies: New English Contemporary Ballet, Tanzforum Köln, Scapino Ballet, Rotterdam, Finnish Dance Theatre, Helsinki, Ballett Staatstheater Braunschweig, Rumanian National Ballett, The Icelandic Ballet, Ballet National de Nancy et de Lorraine, Ballet National de Marseille, Ballet de l'Opéra de Nice, Aalto Balletto, Theater Essen, Europa Danse (UNESCO), Ballett der Deutschen Oper am Rhein Düsseldorf Duisburg, Singapore Dance Theatre, Ballett der Vereinigten Bühnen Graz, Introdans in Arnheim, Holland, Ballett des Badischen Staatstheaters Karlsruhe, Phoenix Dance Theatre, Leeds und Ballet Contemporaneo del Teatro San Martín/Argentinien. In addition, he has created works for Les Étoiles de l'Opéra National de Paris.

His choreography for film and television includes a collaboration with Claude Lelouch on the film «Hasards ou Coïncidences» which premiered at the Biennale in Venice and was presented at the Film Festivals in Montreal and Chicago.

His choreography for the Swiss television dance film «Passengers», produced by SF DRS, RM Associates and 3SAT, was awarded the Prix Italia in 2000. His second TV film collaboration with SF DRS, «One bullet left», received the «Rose d'On» at the International Festival for Television- Entertainment in 2003. In 1999 Richard Wherlock was nominated for the «Benois de la Danse» Prize.

His particular interest lies in the artistic nurturing of the younger generation.

Artistic Direction and Team

Amanda Bennett – Director Ballettschule Theater Basel



Born in Amarillo Texas, USA, Amanda Bennett studied at the School of American Ballet in New York. Her first engagement was at the Ballet du Grand Théâtre de Genève under the Artistic Direction of George Balanchine. From 1978 to 1989 she was engaged as Principal Dancer with the Basler Ballett under the direction of Heinz Spoerli, and during the 1989-90 season performed with Pennsylvania Ballet. Amanda Bennett has worked as Ballet Mistress, Rehearsal Director and Choreographic Assistant for among others, The Feld Ballet in New York, Ballet du Grand Theatre de Genève, Luzerner Ballett, Bern Ballett and Ballett Freiburg Pretty Ugly. Ms. Bennett is an Affiliate Teacher of the American Ballet Theatre National Curriculum, member of the ABT NTC Artistic Board of Examiners and co-founder of the Ballettschule Theater Basel, where she has been Director since 2001. During this time, she was instrumental in bringing the Swiss Federal Diploma for Dance to Basel. In 2015 Ms. Bennett was awarded the Heinz Spoerli Foundation Prize for her outstanding work as Director of the Ballettschule Theater Basel.

From 2012 to 2016 Amanda Bennett was the Artistic Director of the Prix de Lausanne. She is a respected Expert and Jury Member and at many international competitions and dance events.

Julie Christie Wherlock - Director Junior Professional School



Born in Farnborough, Great Britain, Julie Christie Wherlock received her education at The Royal Ballet School London, where she was awarded the Royal Academy of Dancing Solo Seal. In 1977 she started her career as a Soloist with the Hessisches Staatstheater Wiesbaden before becoming Principal Dancer at the Tanz Forum Köln from 1981-1991. Ms. Wherlock is an American Ballet Theatre National Curriculum Affiliate Teacher and member of the ABT NTC Artistic Board of Examiners. She has worked as a guest company and school teacher as well as being a respected jury member at many international competitions.

Ms Christie Wherlock is a cofounder of BTB and has directed the BTB junior school since 2001.

François Petit – Assistant Director



Born in Royan, France, François Petit received his training at the Conservatoire Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris with Attilio Labis. Upon graduation he received the « premier prix a inimitié ». Over the course of his career he was awarded numerous international prizes including the first Prize at the Varna Competition in 1990. The same year he received the prize as Best Young Dancer at the Paris Competition and in 1991 was given a Special Recognition Prize at the Osaka Competition.

His first engagement was as a Soloist with The Royal Ballet of Flanders in Antwerp. He was then invited by Heinz Spoerli to join the Deutsche Oper am Rhein in Düsseldorf, where he created the role of Puck in Mr. Spoerli's new version of "A Midsummer Nights Dream". Mr. Petit was subsequently engaged as Principal Dancer by Heinz Spoerli at the Züricher Ballett, where he danced all the major classical and neo classical roles and toured more than 45 countries.

In 2001 Mr. Petit took over responsibility for the Junior Ballet of the Zürich Opera House. In 2006 the Direction of the Zürich Opera House appointed him to the position of Ballet Master where he remained until 2016. In 2016 he joined Ballettschule Theater Basel as Principal Teacher of Classical Ballet and Pas de deux. He is a regular Guest Teacher for the Royal Ballet London, the Scala di Milano and at the Ballet de Monte Carlo. In 2019 he became the Assistant Director of BTB.

Jorge García Pérez – Head of Modern Department



Born in Zaragoza, Spain, Jorge García Pérez trained at the Escuela de danza Maria de Avila in Zaragoza. After completing his studies he danced with Ballet Biarritz for a season and then with the Sybaa Dance Company. In 2005 he joined the Zürich Ballett. Mr Perez is currently a soloist with Ballett Theater Basel, is a freelance choreographer and Director of the project «Carta Blanca». Over the course of his career he has worked with

renowned choreographers such as Jiří Kylian, Nacho Duato, Heinz Spoerli and Ohad Naharin and has choreographed for the San Francisco Ballet.

In 2018, Mr. Perez created «Golden Insomnia», arranged by Philip Kannicht and Scott Roller, for the BTB Summer Gala. He joined the teaching faculty in 2019 as modern teacher for the professional program and became Head of the Modern Department in 2021. In addition to his artistic position, he is responsible for BTB social media channels.

Principal Teacher

Risa Yajima-Boisnon



Born in Cologne Germany.

Risa received her training at the Institute for Dance in Cologne, at the Royal Ballet School in London and at the Ballet School of the Hamburg State Opera.

Her engagements as a professional dancer included the Basel Ballet, the Bonn Opera, the Deutsche Oper am Rhein Düsseldorf/Duisburg, the Semper Opera in Dresden, where she advanced to soloist, the Leipzig Opera and the Zurich Ballet.

After her professional career, Risa completed her training as a ballet teacher with a degree at the Zurich University of Music and Dance, graduating with a Master of Advanced Studies ZFH in Dance Education.

Risa has been teaching Classical Ballet at the Zurich Opera House Ballet School since the year 2007 and since 2014 she has been a guest teacher for the Junior Company in Zurich. Since 2021 she works as a ballet teacher at BTB.

Arman Grigoryan



Born in Jerevan, Armenia, Arman Grigoryan received his dance training at The Armenian National Ballet School and in 2001 began his career with The Israeli Ballet. In 2002 Mr. Grigoryan joined the Züricher Junior Ballett, two years later advanced to the main company and in 2007 was promoted to Soloist. In 2015 he performed for one season with the Staatsballett Berlin. Over the course of his career Mr. Grigoryan won a Prize at the Prix de Lausanne and placed first for the Varna Revelation Award. In 2008 he received The Heinz Spoerli Foundation Award as well as ‚Les Étoiles Prix‘ from the the magazin Ballet 2000.

After his performing career Mr. Grigoryan assisted in the staging of Heinz Spoerli's 'Goldberg Variations' at La Scala and is currently a Coach for The Prix de Lausanne.

Mr. Grigoryan joined the BTB faculty in 2019. He also teaches at the Zürcher Hochschule der Künste, TanzWerk101 and at the Yen Han Tanzzentrum. He is cofounder and a member of the dance group 'Forceful Feelings'.

Lawrence Rigg



Raised near Oxford, England, Lawrence trained at The Royal Ballet School in London. Upon graduating with Honours in 2005, he joined the Zurich Junior Ballet under the direction of Heinz Spoerli. In 2007 he entered the Ballet du Capitole in Toulouse as a demi-soloist before dancing with Victor Ullate Ballet in Madrid for two seasons. In 2010 Lawrence joined the B ejart Ballet in Lausanne where he stayed for a decade. During his career, Lawrence travelled extensively and performed in works from Heinz Spoerli, George Balanchine, Uwe Scholtz, Jiri Kylian, Peter Martins and Maurice B ejart as well as participating in creations by Gil Roman, Alonzo King and Giorgio Madia among others.

Since leaving the stage in 2020, Lawrence has been on the faculty at the AFJD in Lausanne, guest teacher with B ejart Ballet and Rudra School in Lausanne, and is currently studying for his Diploma of Dance Teaching from the Royal Ballet School. He joins the BTB team in August 2021.

Administrative Direction

Antonio Anecchiarico – Administrative Director



Born in Basel, Switzerland. Antonio Anecchiarico studied economics in Basel and international relations at the HSG in St. Gallen. After completing his Master's degree, his first work experience was in strategic management consulting. He then transferred to strategic planning at Orange Communications in Lausanne and took over positions in marketing and product management. In 2001 he became managing director of the Pathé multiplex cinema in Dietlikon. He subsequently took over the management of the operations in Basel and shortly after became the General Manager for Pathé Cinemas in the German-speaking part of Switzerland. He was a member of the executive board of Pathé Switzerland and president of the Basel Cinema Association. At Pathé, he was extensively involved in the live broadcasts of the Bolshoi Ballet. After almost 10 years at Pathé, Mr. Anecchiarico founded his own business and worked as a consultant for a wide variety of companies – mainly in the childcare and hospitality sectors. Antonio Anecchiarico took over the administrative direction of BTB in September 2021. His passion for dance, combined with his management skills, will usher in a new era of growth to BTB.

Housing

Monika Linge – Head of Student Housing



Born in Germany, Monika Linge successfully completed her studies in industrial commerce and went on to work for the Technische Textilien Lörrach AG, Vitrashop Weil / Rhein, Wybert GmbH Lörrach, Dr. Osypka GmbH Rheinfelden-Herten and Tex4Tec Lörrach GmbH Lörrach-Brombach. Ms Linge has been Head of Student Housing since February 2013.

Curriculum

Senior Professional Division - Admission by Audition only

The Ballettschule Theater Basel offers a full-time professional program for students ages 13 – 18 who wish to pursue dance as a career. A solid foundation in classical ballet is required.

Our goal is to prepare talented young dancers to meet the multifaceted demands of the major professional companies of today. In addition to an excellent classical ballet education, students are exposed to many different styles of contemporary dance as well as the work of some of today's greatest choreographers. Great value is placed on the personal development of our students. Small classes insure optimal individual attention. The close relationship to Ballett Basel insures a professional working atmosphere, provides students with a source of inspiration and sets the standard for professional excellence. Our atmosphere and philosophy encourage young dancers to respect the art form of dance, to develop their curiosity and openness to new ideals, to work independently and to learn the importance of discipline and taking responsibility. All qualities which allow our students to blossom into cultivated adults as well as highly proficient dancers.

- **Teachers**

Our staff comprises teachers and artists of the highest international quality. Main teachers for the Senior Professional Division are **Amanda Bennett, Francois Petit, Jorge García Pérez, Arman Grigoryan and Lawrence Rigg**. Students also work with guest teachers such as Stefanie Arndt, David Peden, Ethan Stiefel, Michael Langeneckert and Sara Lourenco.

- **Curriculum**

Classical ballet technique, pointe, variations, pas de deux, modern / contemporary, music theory and history, dance history, anatomy, Pilates and yoga. In the last year of study, students who demonstrate sufficient maturity and technical ability are selected to take class with Ballett Basel.

- **Assessments**

Students are given an assessment 4 times a year. Exams are conducted at the end of the school year. Advancement to the next level is granted to students who have achieved the required technical demands for their level, who have worked in a disciplined, enthusiastic manner throughout the year and have demonstrated [maturity appropriate to their age](#).

- **Performance Opportunities**

As dance is a live, performing art form, stage time is a critical part of our students training. All students participate in BTB's annual performance of "The Nutcracker" as well as the "Summer Gala". At the Summer Gala students present traditional classical ballets, works of well know choreographers as well as new creations. Students have additional opportunities to perform in the Theater Basel's annual "Advent Calendar", lecture demonstrations, productions of Ballett Basel as well as productions of the Theater Basel. Performances take place on the big stage of the Basel Theater as well as on tour.

- **Medical Supervision**

The Ballettschule Theater Basel works with a team of doctors and therapists who specialize in the specific needs of dancers. This same group of medical specialists works with Ballett Basel. Students have immediate access to a qualified orthopaedic surgeon, physical therapists and general practitioners.

- **Career Planning**

The final of study year is devoted to refining technique and the preparation necessary to audition for professional companies. Students learn how to present themselves, how to prepare a Curriculum vita and how to judge which photos should be included. Students are additionally made aware of the size and styles of different companies, as well as the type of dancer suited to the individual choreographers and are assisted in choosing auditions appropriate to their talents.

- **Professional Placements**

Students of Ballettschule Theater Basel have received contracts in, among others, the following companies: American Ballet Theater Studio Company, Ballett Semper Oper Dresden, Royal Danish Ballet, Finnish National Ballet, Los Angeles Ballet, San Francisco Ballet Trainee Programm, Tokyo Ballet, Dutch National Ballet Trainee Programm, Scapino Ballet, Deutsche Oper am Rhein Düsseldorf, Ballett Nürnberg, Oldenburgisches Staatstheater, Ballet National de Marseille, Latvian National Opera and Ballet, Ballet of the Opera Haus Graz, Croatian National Ballet, St. Louis Ballett U.S.A., Ballet Junior Geneva, Zürich Junior Ballett, Ballett Theater Basel.

Academic Education

All students are encouraged to complete their academic education. At BTB we offer the following possibility:

Professional Dance Training in Classical Dance (EFZ), (Duration: 4 years with an option for a 5th year of specialization)

Upon passing their written and practical examinations, students completing the Professional Dance Programme (EFZ) will be awarded a federally recognized national diploma. To be eligible for this state-recognised qualification, candidates must have attended the entire four-year course.

Candidates aged 13 to 18 should submit their applications on our online Audition form www.btb.ch/audition

Requirements:

- Physical aptitude for classical ballet
- Professional basis in classical ballet
- Fundamentals of modern dance
- Advanced knowledge of German or English

Housing

Boarding House

Students outside the region of Basel between the ages of 13 and 15 live in the school's boarding house. The house is located 10 minutes from the theater and offers 24-hour supervision as well as a cozy, family like atmosphere for our younger students. Our staff prepares nutritious meals and takes care of the daily needs of the students.

Shared Apartments

Older students share houses. The student house for the boys and the student house for the girls are under the supervision of our staff who are always ready to help students with problems or questions. Additionally, the overnight presence of our staff ensures additional security. The houses are furnished, have laundry facilities, fully equipped kitchens and internet connection.

Visa requirements

Upon acceptance to BTB, you will be asked to fill out an online form.

If you are from a EU/EFTA country, BTB will be able to arrange your visa with the information received on the form.

If you are from a non-EU/EFTA country, you will need to apply for your visa individually at the Swiss Embassy in your home country.

In all cases, the following documents will be needed to complete registration.

- «Lehrvertrag» / contract with the academic school (will be sent by BTB)
- signed BTB student and parent agreement
- registration form with the city of Basel
- passport copy
- passport photo
- confirmation from an orthopedic doctor that the student is physically able to absolve a professional ballet education
- copy health insurance card: it's mandatory in Switzerland to have valid health insurance. For students from EU/EFTA countries you can normally add a European coverage, for other students we recommend "swisscare"

Living in Switzerland – facts and figures

Invoices are issued by BTB's Office. Upon enrolment, families are responsible for the full year's tuition and fees as outlined on the invoice. If a student withdraws during the year, any balance due will still be collected and no refunds of payments to-date will be made.

FAQ – Frequently asked questions

DANCE

How many hours of classes are there per week?

Around 24 – this includes ballet technique, pointe, variations, pas de deux, modern, yoga, and our fitness program.

Are there performances?

We consider performing a very important aspect of a dance education. The school does a full-length production of Nutcracker every December on the main stage of the Basel theater as well as our Summer Gala in late May or June. We additionally do smaller performances and demonstrations throughout the year.

How many students are in a class?

Normally between 8 and 15.

Do you send students to competitions?

We do sometimes send students to competitions, but only when we feel they are at a stage in their development to be able to do well and to profit from the experience. We generally do not send students to competitions in their first year of study. The competitions are usually YAGP or the Prix de Lausanne.

What about school uniforms?

BTB orders the uniforms for you, and they are paid for in advance with the boarding fees. Boys and girls need to provide their own shoes and girls need to provide their own pink tights. We prefer Freed Pointe shoes, but we normally have a representative of Freed visit the school in August to do a proper fitting with each of the girls. As the delivery time for Freed is quite long, we advise new female students to bring enough pointe shoes to last through November.

What is a typical day like?

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday the day starts at 8:15 with ballet class followed either by pointe class, variations, pas de deux or modern. They may also be yoga, fitness, or some rehearsals. Students attend school in the afternoon and there is often a modern class or rehearsal afterschool. On Thursday and Friday there is no academic school, only dance classes. On Saturday we have classes for half a day and as the year goes on sometimes rehearsals in the afternoon.

Where are your graduates working?

We have a placement rate of 85 – 95 %.

Our graduates have started their careers in companies around the world including: Ballett Basel, Zürich Junior Ballet, ABT Studio Company, English National Ballet, NDT2, Royal Danish Ballet, Las Angeles Ballet, Ballet Dortmund, Finnish National Ballet, Croatian National Ballet, Ballett der Deutsche Oper am Rhein Düsseldorf, Scapino Ballet and many others.

ACADEMIC SCHOOL

All students (unless they are only doing a last finishing year) attend academic school in Basel. The school is called the HWS – Huber Wiedemann Schule. It is a 4 year program that finishes with a Swiss Federal Diploma in Professional Dance (in German EFZ). Students attend school Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. The subjects are mostly dance related such as dance history, music theory and history, anatomy, nutrition, German, English and social studies.

In addition to the school in Basel, all students are encouraged to finish their high school diplomas from their home countries by distance learning.

Classes are conducted in English and German. Students are required to have a good written and spoken understanding of English. A minimum of Level A2 in Europe or the IELTS test that is required in England.

Costs for books and school material is a one time fee of about CHF 250.-.

HOUSING

Students ages 13 – 15 live in the Boarding House. It is a 5 minute walk from the Theater and is fully supervised 24/7. All meals are provided. Our staff assists with laundry or anything else the student needs. They also accompany students to the doctor if they are ill. If you like you may bring your own bed linen and towels otherwise they will be provided.

Girls ages 16 – 19 live in the girl's Villa. It is a 10 minute tram ride from the Theater. The Villa is furnished and has a fully equipped kitchen and laundry facilities. Girls cook for themselves. If you like you may bring your own bed linen and towels. The Villa is partially supervised.

Boys ages 16 – 19 live in the Boys's House. It is a 20 minute tram ride from the Theater. The House is furnished and has a fully equipped kitchen and laundry facilities. If you like you may bring your own bed linens and towels. Boys cook for themselves. The Villa is partially supervised.

Rooms are shared with other students.

There are washing machines and dryers in the apartments. They can be used for free. The housing staff is happy to assist with doing laundry.

Are personal items left in the residence during holidays?

Students may leave personal items in the residence during the holidays. Before the summer break students are required to clear out all cupboards so that everything is properly cleaned!

Do students have to move out during the breaks?

Students may stay in the student housing during breaks at a small extra cost.

GENERAL

All students are required to have health insurance.

Foreign insurance policies can be accepted in Switzerland. However, we recommend all students to register for a Swiss health insurance specifically for students. Costs are about CHF 1000 per year. We recommend Swiss Care.

Do I need a visa for Switzerland?

Yes, all students from foreign country need a visa.

For students from the EU/EFTA BTB, BTB will apply for the visa. To do so, we require the complete registration submitted that is sent to you after acceptance confirmation.

Students who are not from the EU/EFTA need to apply for their visa individually at the Swiss embassy of their home country. You will need the confirmation of study attached for the visa application, which is provided to you by BTB after acceptance confirmation. If there's anything else needed, let us know! It's a bit different from country to country.

Are the costs for the uniform to be paid annually and does it include shoes?

The cost of the uniform is one time for most things. Only a new leotard must be purchased when the students advance to the next level. It does not include shoes.

What happens in the event that a student is sick and unable to attend training/school?

In the event that a student is sick, they should inform the teachers and our Head of Student Housing before class begins. If they need to see a doctor we make an appointment for them and a member of staff will accompany them to the doctor. If they are sick longer than 3 days they are required to go to the doctor. There is also a physical therapist in the theater every day for emergencies. We also have an orthopedic doctor that will see students immediately if the need arises. A member of staff is always happy to accompany students to the doctor.

What do students usually do on the weekend day/s off?

On the weekend students usually do shopping, homework and sleep. ☺ If it's nice weather they often go for a picnic in the park or have dinner together. There are also seasonal events in Basel to visit like the Fall Fair and the Christmas Market.

What is the exact start date of the school year and when does it end?

We start 15th of August 2022 and finish the end of June.
Holidays: first week of October, two weeks for Christmas, one week in March and five days for Easter.

Where are the studios located?

The studios are located in close distance to the housings. One studio is located within walking distance, the others are accessible by public transport - the tram goes directly to the studio.

Students benefit from a discount on public transport fees.
